Dear Friends,

The Art Therapy Outreach Center (ATOC) experienced another year of significant growth in 2014, while also strengthening our organization to facilitate continued expansion for years to come. We added more program partners, launched new art therapy groups, broadened our services, expanded our team, and served many more clients. Highlights from 2014 include:

- Provided free art therapy to nearly 800 clients, a 63% increase over 2013
- Developed new partnerships with Andrew Glover Youth Program, New Alternatives for Children, New York Presbyterian Hospital and Publicolor
- Introduced Medical Art Therapy and Photography Art Therapy
- Hired our first full time Clinical Director
- Created a Young Professionals Committee and held our first YP event
- Increased annual support and revenue by 21%

ATOC offered 26 art therapy groups during the year. Half of the groups were for youth and adolescents and included children in foster care, court-involved youth, adolescents with complex medical issues and at-risk youth. These groups focused on conflict resolution, anger management, teen pregnancy prevention and leadership skills building. We also conducted adult groups for male, female and homeless war veterans, as well as groups for male and female survivors of sexual abuse, 9-11 survivors, drug dependent adults, and others. The groups were dedicated to clients facing the challenges of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), Military Sexual Trauma (MST), homelessness, substance abuse, medical trauma and sexual trauma. In addition, we were pleased to broaden our offerings by introducing photography art therapy and medical art therapy.

During ATOC's first three years of full operations we successfully achieved our short term vision to be the leading provider of free art therapy services to underserved populations in the NYC area. Now we have developed a new Strategic Plan for 2015-2017 which will guide us through this next important chapter. The Plan sets forth goals in each key area including organizational, programming, fundraising and marketing, collectively designed to improve our operating efficiency and broaden our human resources to stimulate growth and fundraising; create more diverse program options to better serve our clients; and establish an ATOC brand that appeals to supporters and program partners while reflecting both our clinical work and our contribution to the field of art therapy.

The demand for free art therapy continues to intensify and ATOC remains the only nonprofit in New York dedicated solely to art therapy. We are grateful to the many individuals, foundations and companies who supported us through the year and we welcome our new program partners, friends and donors who have joined ATOC in striving to make free art therapy accessible to some of our City's most needy. We look forward to working with all of you.

WHAT IS ART THERAPY?

Art therapy is a treatment method that uniquely combines art and psychology to explore the problems and potentials of individuals. It is a specialized way of using the power of the creative process as a vehicle for healing, communication, self-expression and personal development. Art therapy focuses on the process of art -making itself, rather than the finished product, as a means of healing. An Art Therapist needs knowledge of the visual arts and the creative process, and an understanding of human development as well as psychological and counseling theories and techniques.

In 2014 the Art Therapy Outreach Center provided art therapy services to clients that ranged from 5 to 65 years of age, the majority from low-income communities. Each of the 26 client groups, defined by shared experiences, developed safe relationships and engaged in creative, healthy forms of expression, thereby processing traumatic experiences and developing more adaptive coping skills. ATOC served 782 clients during the year, nearly half of whom were under 21 years of age.




LEFT- an example of work created by one of the male veterans who participated in the first Photo Art Therapy Group.

In My Father's Eye - Carved Wood, Photos and Gauche, 10.5" x 7.5"

"When my father passed always from ALS, I had a difficult time coping with his death. I created this image as if to say that at the moment of his death, he didn't see the adult that had morphed throughout the years, but instead still saw me as his little baby. I chose wood because the same way a tree documents its own span by its rings, this piece also spans my life. I used a dremel tool to carve away the image around the photos, which were wheat pasted. The photos had been reworked through Photoshop. I used gauche as wet on wet and also directly. My background had been art and photography, yet I had not done anything artistic since 2004 due to depression. The Art Therapy Outreach Center has been my safe haven. It has allowed me to start reconnecting to the artist part of myself again. It has inspired me and allowed me to look into myself. This has been extremely cathartic."
