A letter from our Founder.

Dear Friends,

Mental health has always been important, and recent events have now made it a headline topic. The pandemic impacted everyone, but none more so than our youth, who have experienced significantly more trauma, stress and anxiety. With a year of constantly changing mask mandates, vaccine and booster eligibility, and virtual learning requirements, children's relationships have been strained, quality of life has been diluted and support systems have diminished.

In October 2021, a report published by The New School Center for New York City Affairs, *Kids' Mental Health, by the Numbers*, stated that New York City's community-based mental health system for youth is broken. The statistics are daunting: according to this report, out of 3.6 million kids aged 2 - 17 in New York State, approximately 1 in 5 children has an emotional, behavioral or developmental condition; and suicide is the second leading-cause of death for New York adolescents and young adults aged 15 – 21. It is evident that there exists a systemwide shortage of mental health care for kids, and adults aren't far behind.

Fortunately, with your support, The Art Therapy Project remained open and continued to provide art therapy to both youth and adults throughout COVID-19. Despite the downsides of 2021, we overcame unexpected challenges and persisted as a leader in the field. When the pandemic first began we quickly pivoted from in-person therapy to online TeleArt Therapy. In 2021 we expanded our TeleArt programming while re-introducing in-person art therapy groups when circumstances allowed. And now we are on a mission to make hybrid programming available so that people can choose to attend our studio-based groups either in-person or remotely. Implementing these innovations required us to overcome significant clinical and logistical issues, and I'm proud that our professional team was up to the task, all for the sake of finding ways to help more of those in need. Here are a few more highlights from 2021:

- The Art Therapy Project was recognized by the New York State Education Department's State Board for Psychology as an approved provider of continuing education for licensed psychologists.
- *Together We Are The Light*, the online client art exhibition, featured 54 pieces of art from our veteran, youth and LGBTQIA+ groups.
- The Young Professionals Leadership Group raised over \$14,000 for programs in their first fitness fundraiser, Move for Mental Health.
- TATP received Guidestar's Platinum Seal of Transparency, which acknowledged our achievements, governance, best practices and the positive impact of our free art therapy services for trauma survivors.

Our work aims to improve the quality of life for our community's most vulnerable populations, children and adults alike, and we are proud to have served more than 8,200 people since we first opened our doors, ten years ago. One of our clients stated:

JANUARY

MARCH

TATP introduced a new Wellness Workshops program for businesses looking to promote teambuilding, communication, and wellness in the workplace. Our pilot workshop took place virtually with KWT Global with one participant stating, ""I enjoyed carving out time in my day to create art in ways I wouldn't normally do so. I enjoyed having an opportunity to interact with co-workers in a new and creative way outside our typical day-to-day." Workshops addressing staff burnout, pandemic-related stress and anxiety were also made available to nonprofit organizations looking to provide support for their staff's well-being.



APRIL

In recognition of April being Sexual Assault Awareness month, we spoke to art therapist, Valeria Koutmina MPS, ATR-BC, LCAT to learn about the sexual assault TeleArt Therapy group she runs for us. She educated our audiences on how to support sexual assault surivors; unique virtual art directives; and her approach to addressing sensitive topics without triggering emotions. The night was filled with performances by Cameron Mitchell Bell and Hannah Cruz (Broadway Performers); Alec Berlin (Guitarist and Composer); Mary Cordelia (Ukulele and Comedy); Coby Koehl (Singer/Songwriter/Recording Artist); The Litton Duo (Piano and Viola Duet); Phat Man Dee (Cosmic Jazz Cabaret Vocalist); and Steven Taylor (Mufasa from The Lion King!). 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JULY

The Young Professionals Leadership Group hosted Move For Mental Health, a 3-week fitness challenge that raised over \$14,000 for art therapy programs. Participants ran, did yoga and pilates, cycled, walked and danced throughout the month of July collecting pledges along the way. 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AUGUST

We are proud to have earned the highest rating from Guidestar since it introduced the platinum level.



SEPTEMBER

Over the past year, TATP worked with abstract artist Preston Zeller on developing his feature-length documentary, The Art of Grieving. The film focuses on grief and art in connection to the unexpected loss of Preston's 35-year old brother. Our Clinical Director, Lindsay Lederman, was featured in the film and offered clinical insight on art, art therapy and healing. One review stated, "The Art of Grieving makes the case for art therapy, in all its forms, as an effective and visually stunning way of finding meaning in tragedy."



OCTOBER

Celebrate Art Therapy in Action hosted by Mia Jackson, our annual fundraiser, raised over \$50,000 for our art therapy programs. NOVEMBER

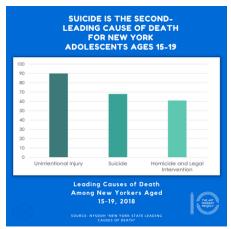

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DECEMBER

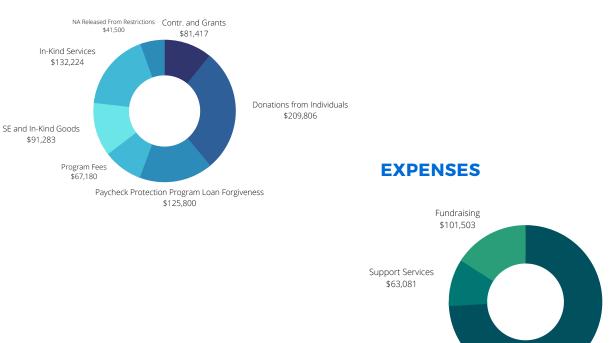
