ATOC's programs are conducted in small group sessions with participants with a shared common experience, such as past abuse or being a war veteran. Each module meets weekly for 90-minute sessions for eight to twelve weeks, at ATOC's studio or at the program partner's site. The art therapist offers participants supplies provided by ATOC, and clients create a piece of art - a drawing, a sculpture, a collage, a painting - that can be completed either during a single session or over several sessions, individually or as a group. During the creative process, the therapist observes and engages clients in processing and developing their imagery, while participants are encouraged to speak openly and gain support from each other in a safe and trusting environment.


